1. COURSE GOAL

The aim of the course is to familiarize students with the historical and political contexts, the stages and motivating reasons for the emergence and evolution of the European system of human rights protection; to consider the mechanisms for the protection of human rights in the framework of the Council of Europe; to analyze the activities of the Commissioner for Human Rights, the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR), focusing on the organization and competence of the latter to consider individual complaints; to study the conditions of complaint procedure of the ECtHR, the procedure for reviewing complaints and executing the decisions of the ECtHR made on the merits of the case, the amendments made by Protocol No. 14 to the Convention on Human Rights of 1950 and the directions for further reform of the ECtHR (Interlaken and Izmir Declarations); to assess the process of the European Union's accession to the 1950 Convention on Human Rights.

The main objectives of the course include the following: to instill skills of independent analysis of the content of applicable international legal sources; to give basic knowledge about the European system of human rights protection; to explain the essence, subject, meaning of the discipline "European system of Human Rights protection", as well as the main trends in the development of this discipline at the present stage; to study the norms of the legislation of the Council of Europe; to study the activities of the European Court of Human Rights; to analyze the activities of the European Court of Human Rights; to analyze the activities of the institutions of the European Union; to analyze the impact of the activities of the European Court of Human Rights and its decisions on the national legal order.
