1. COURSE GOALS

The purpose of studying the discipline "Global Financial Centers" is to form an understanding of the most important laws of the functioning of world financial centers (GFC), as one of their important participants in the world economy.

The structure of the discipline is structured in such a way as to cover topics most closely related to the problems of the modern world economy and international economic relations. Among them are the role and place of world financial centers, the stages and conditions of their formation, structure, organization features, etc.

The main objectives of studying the discipline are:

To study the history of the formation and development of centers in all their diversity – trade, monetary, financial;

To study the historical prerequisites for the formation of the GFC;

To study the conceptual apparatus closely related to the GFC;

To study the features of the organization and functioning of the GFC;

To study the role and place of the GFC in the global economy;

To study the main GFC s operating in the world today;

To study the role and place of special and free economic zones, and their interaction with the GFC.
