1. COURSE GOALS:

The main goal of the course “Lexicography Methods” is to introduce students to methodological base of Lexicography. Dictionary research will also be exposed. As this is a graduate level module, students are expected to deal with the linguistic analysis of dictionaries, corpus and database in a critical way. Students should master general problems of Lexicology and its Methods.

Course goals:

- determine methodological background and concepts of the lexicology;
- study basic of principles of dictionary production;
- study words corpus and databases of different types;
- analyze tools and methods of developing corpus, database.
