#### 1. COURSE GOAL(s)

The main purpose of the course is to introduce students to the arrangement of constitutional law of the USA, from the origins of the state to present day.

Upon completion of the course the student is expected to:

**know** the basic theoretical issues related to the formation of the constitutional system of the USA during various periods of history and to the place of the governmental and local property in the economic basis of the society; the prime characteristics of social obligations in the USA's constitutional arrangement; the public authorities' capacity in the domain of public and private property regulation, management and control;

have an idea of the primary directions of the constitutional reform, the arrangement and issues of legal regulation of government and local authorities' contractual and financial relations; be capable of generalization of the USA's experience in successfully handling the matters of local significance; make their own justified suggestions regarding the trajectories of further improvement of the economic basis of government and local authorities.

**be able to** handle the constitutional, local, administrative, civil and other specific legislation regarding the matters of compound regulation of the governmental and private property relations; analyse the subject matter of the legislative acts in the field and their application, distinguish the acts of higher priority in the public and private property relations regulation hierarchy; characterize the public authorities' place and capacity in the domain of ownership relations;

have an idea of the basic legal mechanics of the constitutional regulation of ownership, including governmental, local and private ownership management, the primary constitutional legislative principles of influencing the course of citizens' personal, political, socio-economic and cultural rights, the biggest issues of the field and prospects of their resolution.

have acquired the skills of public debate regarding the matters of legal foundation to the state's participation in economic and social fields, analysis of the primary legal methods and means of constitutional regulation of economic and social relations, and drafting of the essential prerequisite material for further use in preparing the drafts of legislative acts in the domain of regulation of government's interference into economic and social fields.
