1. GOAL OF DISCIPLINE MASTERING

The discipline “Russian for Foreign Students” is included in the master’s program “Ballistic Design of Space Complexes and Systems” in the direction 01.04.02 “Applied Mathematics and Computer Science” and is studied in the 1st semester of the 1st year. The discipline is implemented by the Department of Russian Language 4. The discipline consists of 3 sections and 29 topics and is aimed at studying the Russian language at basic and elementary levels as a means of communication in a Russian-speaking language environment and a way of getting to know Russia, its social, scientific, economic and cultural life.

The goal of mastering the discipline is to obtain knowledge, skills and abilities in the field of Russian-language communication in order to master socio-cultural competencies, develop the ability to integrate into the Russian-speaking environment and communicate in it (everyday, everyday and cultural communication) with a minimum level of proficiency in the Russian language.
