1. COURSE GOAL(s)

The course is designed to contribute to the students' knowledge about state and law, about the main branches of law, as well as to form sustainable legal skills in the area of professional activity. The discipline "Law Science" is included in the "Dentistry" program in the field of studies 31.05.03 "Dentistry" and is studied in the 3rd semester of the 2nd year. The discipline is implemented by the Department of Theory of Law and State. The discipline consists of 9 modules (sections) and 44 topics and is aimed at studying basic legal concepts and legal structures, relationships between legal phenomena.

The goal of mastering the discipline is to acquire basic knowledge by students about fundamentals of the theory of law and legislation of the Russian Federation.
