The course instruction is implemented within the professional education programme of higher education:

> "Language and Culture: Theory and Practice" (in English)

1. COURSE GOALS:

The main goal of the course is to introduce students to the history of English literature with special attention to its most characteristic and influential texts. The study of the history of English literature involves an integrative approach to the studies of literary theory, critical methods, cultural semiotics and cultural history, as well as the methodology of literary analysis. The discipline is designed to expand the students' erudition and broaden their philological horizon. The illustrative basis for the discipline is provided by the most outstanding works of English writers that reflect the achievements of the English culture and the stages of its progress. Apart from providing the students with a vast scope of cultural and semiotic knowledge, the course also aims to develop the students' practical skills in the sphere of philological professional activities, such as textual analysis and literary criticism.
