1. THE GOAL OF MASTERING DISCIPLINE

The discipline “Customs aspects of the movement of goods in international trade” is included in the master’s program “International Trade” in the direction of 04/38/01 “Economics” and is studied in the 1st semester of the 1st year. The discipline is implemented by the Department of International Economic Relations. The discipline consists of 6 sections and 16 topics and is aimed at studying the customs aspects of the movement of goods in international trade

The goal of mastering the discipline is to develop in students a comprehensive perception of all institutions of customs regulation in the Eurasian Economic Union and to develop practical skills in using the regulatory framework for customs regulation of foreign trade activities.
