## **EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMME GOAL (MISSION)**

The purpose of the educational program of Master's degree in the direction of training "International Relations" is to develop personal qualities in students, as well as to provide comprehensive and quality training of competitive, highly qualified specialists, capable of creative solution of theoretical and practical problems of professional activity in modern conditions on the basis of development of skills, abilities and competencies in accordance with the requirements of the RUDN educational standard in this direction of training, necessary for future specialists.

## **2. EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMME RELEVANCE, SPECIFICITY, AND UNIQUENESS**

The program is implemented entirely in English. The key feature of the program is that it is based on the principle of interdisciplinarity, which allows analysing various aspects of international relations. The Master's program includes situational analytical workshops in the study of con-temporary international relations, international security, international conflicts. Each of the teaching staff implementing the program has its own regional specialization, possessing knowledge of history and culture, ethno-confessional and political situation, foreign policy and diplomacy of the countries of one of the world regions (Europe, North America, Far East, Middle East, Africa, Latin America) in accordance with the foreign language he/she speaks. In addition, each of the teachers specializes in one of the aspects of international cooperation (security, diplomacy, integration, etc.), being in his/her field one of the leading experts in Russia. Another important feature of the MA program is the active participation of practitioners from the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Federal Agency for CIS Affairs, Compatriots Living Abroad and International Humanitarian Cooperation (Rossotrudnichestvo), other federal ministries and agencies, leading professors and researchers from the Diplomatic Academy of the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, MGIMO (U) of the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the Institute of Far East Studies of the Russian Academy of Sciences.

## **3. LABOUR MARKET NEEDS FOR PERSONNEL TRAINING IN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMME PROFILE**

According to the professional purpose and qualification characteristics, the activity of a Master in International Relations is aimed at analysing events and phenomena in the system of international relations, international organizations and associations, problems and trends in the development of world politics, issues of international and national security, foreign policy of the Russian Federation and other states. Master's activity in the field of international relations provides for the performance of functions of analysts and strategy developers, employees who develop and make decisions within their competence, analysts and researchers, teachers and managers of different levels, translator-referent in the relevant foreign language when working in government agencies, government and non-government organizations, scientific and educational institutions of the Russian Federation, in the mass media (mass media) - as columnists.

The analysis of the employment of the graduates shows that the overwhelming majority of the students of the department at the end of their studies are successfully employed. The main professions in which the graduates of the department work are: diplomat,

international expert, analyst, international journalist, lawyer, economist, manager. As for the positions held, the range is quite wide: from a bank teller to the first secretary of an embassy and an employee of the Administration of the President of the Russian Federation.

#### 4. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR POTENTIAL APPLICANTS

The applicant must have a state document of higher education (at the bachelor's/specialist level), if it has a record of higher education (at the bachelor's/specialist level) or an equivalent document of a foreign state, as well as successfully pass the entrance test. Additional requirements for the applicant are determined by the Rules of admission of citizens to the Federal State Educational Autonomous Institution of Higher Education Peoples' Friendship University of Russia named after Patrice Lumumba.
