1. GOAL OF DISCIPLINE MASTERING

The discipline “Jurisprudence” is included in the undergraduate program “Data Engineering and Space Systems Control” in the direction of 27.03.04 “Control in Technical Systems” and is studied in the 5th semester of the 3rd year. The discipline consists of 8 sections and 40 topics and is aimed at studying basic legal concepts and legal structures, relationships between legal phenomena. Based on the results of mastering the discipline, students must learn to correlate the theoretical knowledge acquired while studying this course with practical needs. The course creates an opportunity to systematize legal knowledge and form in students systematic ideas about the state and legal life of society. The content of the course is dictated by the desire to form in students ideas about the basic concepts of the science of law, the features of mutual influence and interaction of legal phenomena, and to reveal the foundations of the most important legal institutions.

The goal of mastering the discipline is for students to acquire knowledge in the field of the fundamentals of the theory of state and law, the leading branches of the Russian legal system, and the fundamentals of legal regulation of future professional activities.

2. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE RESULTS OF MASTERING THE DISCIPLINE
