The main goal of this course is to enhance the skills of students in conquering the fear of public speaking and presentation. It will equally equip them with tools for self-evaluation, developer skills and presentation (academic and non-academic) of informative and persuasive messages for impact.

The main objectives are:

1. To learn effective ways of delivering verbal and nonverbal (including the use of visual aids components) messages in public.

2. To boost interpersonal skills in mastering the strategies of persuasive communication of information, opinions, and arguments.

3. To learn the development of speech skills through planning, brainstorming, research, organization and outlining.
